

Thank you for making 2022 yet another remarkable year for Mobius, Inc. While this year was filled with Covid 19 Pandemic issues, it was also a year of reinvigoration and growth. Our dedicated staff have persevered in supporting clients to live full lives despite the Pandemic and tremendous staffing shortages. We have worked diligently on complying with new Home and Community Based Waiver requirements, lived through several construction projects at various sites, and have gone through a change in leadership in January 2022.

A few program highlights include:

**Hiring/Promoting -** new Executive Director, Director of Behavioral Health, Clinical Services Director, and Adult Waiver Services Director all from within current Mobius employees.

**Construction** – Creating new office space at 319 Main St to include Behavioral Health Services at one site, Remodeling bathroom at KHouse to allow for better accessibility.

**Promoting Volunteering** – supporting clients to give back to their home community by volunteering – dog walking, delivering groceries, woodworking projects, etc.

**Community Membership** - reinventing our Community Support Program to a Community Membership Program. No longer facility based. Client get more individualized support.

For the coming year, we will work towards further revitalization and reinvigoration by focusing on Community collaboration, engagement, and involvement by both staff and clients.


Our Vision is to see all people have the same opportunities within the community regardless of ability.
